It is with great sadness that the family of Brett Hoopingarner announces his passing peacefully in his sleep, on May 8, 2019, at the age of 54.

He will be lovingly remembered by his mother, Joyce and his two sisters, Erin Maranjian and Stella St Vincent. He was pre-deceased by his brother, Kurt in 2006, and his father, Jan Harlan Hoopingarner in 2003. He will also be greatly missed by his nieces, Sarah Parmenter, Emily Messer, Bethany Geisert and nephew, David Maranjian. They all remember him as a wonderful uncle. He was an imperturbable teacher who created many great memories for his family. His "wait-for-it" smirk was his trademark and we all remember it fondly along with his distinctive sense of humor.

Brett was born in Pomona, California on November 5, 1964. He grew up in the southwestern states, spending years in California, New Mexico, Arizona and Colorado. He lived in Colorado for most of his adult life beginning in 1992.

He graduated from Arizona State University in 1991 with a degree in Computer Information Systems with honors, Cum Laude. In 1992 he moved to Fort Collins to work for Book Center of the Rockies. Although it started out as a temporary job to help develop their IT department, he was soon indispensable to the company and remained there for almost 30 years.

Brett's insatiable curiosity and love of learning led him down many interesting paths. In addition to doing for others, he enjoyed many hobbies throughout his life including reading, remodeling, cooking, watching movies/comedy/TED talks, fishing, and playing with technology and gadgets. He took great joy not only in building and creating new things, but in modifying existing things to make them even better. This talent certainly extended to his own life, which he modified and improved beyond recognition in the last several years with the help of an amazing support system including A.A., friends, and family. A.A. played a vital role in his success. Although he left us all too soon, he left at the top of his game.

Brett will be remembered for his great sense of humor and his open-hearted generosity. He was always the first to volunteer for a tough job and the last to leave. He would drop everything to help family, friend or stranger. He was patient and kind, serving others without judgement. He treated his friends and family with respect and grace and a generous dose of humor. He actively fostered many deep and wonderful friendships which we know he cherished. He was a loving and witty friend who will be sorely missed by all those lucky enough to know him. He was a gift to us.

The last time I and Brett had time together was when our senior class gathered at my new home shortly after I married, it was 1991! It was so great to see him at that point.

I have so many wonderful memories of Brett from our time in High School. I think my favorite is when he would do Steve Martins Happy Feet dance!! He used to make me cry from laughing so hard as he acted like he couldn't stop his feet from dancing.

I also loved when he would show up for French class and have NONE of his homework completed; Madame Roberts would hold up her finger and wave it back and forth and say, "Chris tee ahn, Nohn. No excuses!" And Brett would always reply, "But this isn't an excuse...It's because....I couldn't do it since.....There wasn't enough time"You know she never bought into it!

Brett always brought joy and silly laughter into our days. I loved his kindness and thoughtfulness that he always brought to anyone.

One night, two of us girls took Brett out for one of the funniest times we ever had.....We decided that we would do a progressive dinner, yet we would do it by using drive throughs. We had burgers at McDonalds, fries at Burger King, desserts at Dairy Queen. However, because of Brett's uncanny ability to infuse hysterical laughter into an activity, he decided to back up through each drive through. Yes, we proceeded in reverse! We girls were just snorting and guffawing as we tried to be quiet while Brett was ordering nonchalantly with his deadpan face. "Nothing to see here...". If you could have seen the looks the employees shot us this great big car came rumbling up to the window BACKWARDS! They glared at him as he appeared so innocent. My gosh we hurt so bad from laughing.

Hiking the Grand Canyon in high school was a learning experience for us, especially Brett. He was so excited about doing his laundry in the fresh water of the river, so, before turning in for sleep he tied a mesh net bag full of his clothes to a tree and dropped it in the river. He was eager to awake to fresh laundry. Upon removing the bag from the river, he developed a fresh understanding of why the name of the river is The Colorado River: all his

clothes were stained red from the red silt in the water. So the rest of the trip we all laughed as he wore the reddish brown shirt that was previously white. He was such a great sport about it and laughed right along with us!

I remember his amazing inventions. One of his very useful ones was The Video Log. It was a library Card Catalog of sorts in a notebook designed to keep track of what video was watched and where it would be stored to find it to watch it again. He was so lit up while describing it to us and he was so excited about marketing it. I don't remember if he ever did?

High school life with Brett was an absolute joy. He was always so kind and good hearted to anyone. His Monty Python obsession gave all of us such wonderful moments of happiness and delight. I am so thankful to have known him ; I have the warmest memories of him; and with all my heart I pray for your comfort during this time of loss.
