Douglas (Doug) J. Kokes, 52, died October 14, 2019 at UCHealth Hospital in Loveland, CO. A funeral service will be held at 11:00 a.m. Thursday, October 24, 2019 at Timberline Church, 2908 S Timberline Rd, Fort Collins, CO. Immediately following the service, there will be a light reception at the church. A private interment for the family will be held at the Grandview Cemetery.
