ELIZABETH BRAGASSA Betty was born September 15, 1936 in Ayr, Scotland. She survived the bombings of World War II, finished school and was a carpet weaver for several years erasing her fingerprints. Charlie from Texas persuaded her to come away with him and have adventures in America. They were married in Ayr on May 31, 1955 and lived in Texas, Georgia and Colorado. After her four children were launched, Betty entered the nursing profession in Fort Collins, first as an LPN and then an RN, being class valedictorian each time. She worked at Poudre Valley Hospital in Oncology, Orthopedics, Women's Care and five years in Home Care, where she particularly enjoyed meeting some of the local pioneers. She retired from PVH in 2007 after 25 years in nursing. She departed this life at age 77 on September 14, 2013, after a ten-year journey with cancer. Nonetheless, she radiated love, joy, enthusiasm and unique perspectives. Betty was unsurpassed in physical, mental and spiritual beauty – a truly magnificent, elegant lady and an asset to the world.
