Joan Lynn Rosecrans, 75, of Red Feather Lakes passed away suddenly, July 26, 2019. She was born in North Platte, Nebraska on June 16, 1944, one of six children born to Charles George Ell and Elizabeth Russell. Joan graduated from Wahoo Catholic High School and earned a Bachelors degree from John F. Kennedy College in Wahoo, NE.

Joan married Edward Leroy Niebur on September 14, 1963 in Wahoo, NE. Ed and Joan had two sons, Edward, Jr. and Scott. Ed Senior was killed in Vietnam in 1968 serving with the United States Navy. Joan later married Richard Rosecrans on January 16, 1982 and they created a blended family with three more children that included John, William, and Carolynn.

Joan was an incredibly loving grandmother to Brandon, Kyle, Jonas, Savannah, Charleigh and Ryan. She was also an amazing sister to Chuck, John, Pat, Mary and Kathy.
