Marti's passion for life did wonderful things, it created a family, it helped others, and it made her who she was. She was always the life of the party, the most eccentric person in

the room no matter what. She was bold and always wanted to try new things, and she never took life too seriously. She taught those in her life how to enjoy the little things and indulge in life's simple pleasures.
