Albert Baccelli, beloved husband of Margaret "Peggy" Baccelli passed peacefully on July 29th. Al suffered the debilitating effects of Parkinson's and lung disease for the past several years. Al was born to Italian immigrant parents, Erina and Albert Baccelli in San Francisco on February 4, 1931. Al entered the produce business at the age of 13, and continued a long career as a produce buyer, eventually owning an independent supermarket in Menlo Park, California. He served as a corporal in the US Army during the Korean War working as a heavy weapons instructor. Al lived most of his life in the San Francisco Bay Area, before moving to Tahoe, and eventually to Minden, Nevada. In 2001, Al and Peg relocated to Fort Collins, Colorado to be closer to their three daughters. Al and Peggy Baccelli were married in 1952, and would have celebrated 60 love filled years of matrimony on September 6th. Al's enthusiasm for life could be seen in his Italian hospitality, his unfailing sense of humor, his love of fishing, talent for building, Having pounded many nails during the construction of his Tahoe home in the late 1970's. and his deep connection to his national roots and family in Italy. He loved nothing more than to gather his family around the table, especially for a barbecue! Al is survived by his wife Peggy, daughter Theresa Wells, her husband Howard Wells and grandchildren Joshua, Erin, Marcus, Rachel, Jessica, Chrissy & Adam, daughter Catherine Williams and her husband Darrell Williams, daughter Anita Fanelli and husband Dominic Fanelli, Jr. and grandchildren Dominic and Alexandra.
