In 1989 she married Roger Hebbert and gained a daughter, Lisa Spencer (Tracy) and son's Steve Hebbert (Kelly) and Shawn Hebbert (Cindy). She enjoyed her grandchildren, great grandchildren and traveling to see them all grow up.

Bonnie is survived by her husband Roger, four children, ten grandchildren and ten great grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her parents, Lowell and Evelyn Cope, brother Tracy Cope, first husband Jerry Rogers and son Steve Hebbert.

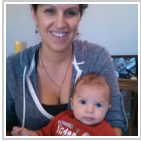
