



Carl R. Nelson

July 12, 1926 - May 16, 2015

Carl R. Nelson, 88, passed away at his home on Saturday, May 16, 2015. He was surrounded by family. Carl was born to Swedish immigrants, Edith and Gunnar Nelson, on July 12, 1926 in Rockford, IL. Carl spent his youth in Rockford with his parents and beloved sister, Elsie, building small sail boats, riding his bike, playing with the Gustasen boys next door, and playing the mandolin in a local band. An instrument he enjoyed “playing” his entire life.

In 1944, Carl enlisted in the United States Army and served in the Asiatic Pacific Theater. While stationed in Japan as part of the occupational force, the first flashes of his entrepreneurial spirit shined through with the successful creation of a laundry service, and several other ventures. After completing his military service, Carl returned to the Chicago area and began working as a stone mason. He worked around Chicago, IL and Omaha, NE for several years before eventually settling in Fort Collins and focusing on custom home building. Carl quickly developed a reputation as a highly skilled mason. These skills, along with his unique design and drafting talents, and overall construction acumen allowed him to rapidly expand his business. His unwavering focus on quality and customer service allowed him to develop a reputation as the premier custom home builder in Fort Collins. Over the years, Carl’s reputation of integrity and focus on quality only continued to strengthen. Many examples of his work exist today in the classic Fort Collins neighborhoods of Parkwood, Lindenmeier, Indian Hills and Warren Shores; to

name a few.

After spending nearly thirty years building custom homes in Fort Collins, in 1982 Carl decided to take a step back from full time home building and to diversify his business by pursuing a career in real estate. A decision Carl often described as the best professional decision he ever made, and one he wished he had made earlier, as it freed him to concentrate on his true passion; working with people. Carl jumped into real estate with both feet, working with several different real estate organizations before joining The Group, Inc. in 1984. Over the next thirty years, Carl worked with countless colleagues and clients; never forgetting a name, a phone number, or a client's address. Carl reveled in answering the next phone call, meeting the next acquaintance, or reconnecting with a homeowner he'd worked with years earlier, and who had since become a friend. Carl earned numerous service awards over the years for his contributions to the community and dedication to his clients. He displayed an unwavering commitment to serve throughout his life. Whether it was working alongside Sister Mary Alice Murphy to design and build low income housing, giving a referral to a colleague, providing a recommendation for a competitor or co-signing a loan for a young entrepreneur starting a new business, Carl was always quick to help however he could. Many successful careers in and around Fort Collins can trace their origins to a gesture from Carl. Words like integrity, class, and a true gentleman are commonly used to describe Carl by those fortunate enough to have known or worked with him.

Not to be overlooked or understated in any way, Carl also served as the principled, yet comforting patriarch to a diverse family of seven children, their spouses, and numerous grandchildren and great grandchildren, all of whom will miss him dearly.

Carl was preceded in death by his parents and his wife Sharon Serbousek-Nelson. He is survived by his sister Elsie Meyer, Rockford IL; his first wife,

Barbara Nelson of Durango, Colorado; daughters Pat Anesi (Greg), Telluride, CO; Sandy Nelson, Pagosa Springs, CO; and five step-children; Tami Serbousek, Fort Collins, CO; Tara Smith (John), Spokane WA; Robyn Young (Ed), Loveland, CO; Linden Serbousek (Vivianne), Windsor, CO, and Chris Serbousek (Kristen), Windsor, CO. Carl is also survived by thirteen grandchildren and five great grandchildren.

A celebration of life will be held on May 27, 2015 at First United Methodist Church in Fort Collins at 11:00 am; reception to follow from noon to 2:00 pm. In lieu of flowers, contributions can be made to the Larimer County Food Bank, CASA of Larimer County or the American Heart Association.

“ We lived right behind Carl and his family when they were on Sheely Drive and we on Birky Place where my Dad and brother still live. Little did I know at the time I was in such close proximity to the consummate professional and gentleman and icon in the Custom Home Building community.

When I started building on my own in 1974, Carl was the well established, premier Custom Home Builder we who were just starting out - wanted to "grow up to be like Carl". I can still remember the first advice he gave me and a friend just starting out. We were building our first home in Parkwood and had decided on a name - Heritage Builders - if I remember correctly, and had proudly put a sign up on the lot we were planning to build on. Carl was driving by and stopped and with his great smile, introduced himself to us and suggested we not use the name we'd chosen, as the previous contractor with that name had gone out of business and left quite a bad reputation in Northern Colorado. Most people would have let us learn a lesson the hard way - which I'm sure Carl had learned many by that point in time - but he did the right thing and taught us a "win-win" philosophy with others in the industry. Many times through the years Carl and I would be considered for the same Custom Home Project and I not only felt honored to be considered in the same context as Carl but also didn't feel so bad if "the master" was awarded the contract rather than me. I can remember one such instance where he did get the job and I didn't, and it ended up being a fairly difficult client and although he wouldn't say it - probably one he'd wished I had gotten. I remember some we'd gotten and with Carl's wisdom may have seen it was one job he was better off not getting.

I always admired his designs, his great smile, his white shirt with rolled up sleeves and his reputation. After moving into Real Estate, he always told me I should do the same. He would continue - Now that I'm in Real Estate, I work with the client between a week to a month, make about the same money and the client is almost always happy with the home and he didn't have to warranty it forever. He'd

go on - the Builder works with a client for months before the job, a year building the project, then at least a year after and you're never guaranteed a happy client despite your best efforts. This was great advice, and yet I could see in his eyes, there was that Designer, Builder and Craftsman part of him that missed the hands on part of the Custom Home Business.

Thank you Carl for being the example, for the years of advice and for the legacy you've left us.
