October 4, 1925 - October 13, 2011

Donald Leo Figurski, loving husband, father, brother, grandfather and friend, died October 13, 2011 at Columbine West Nursing Home in Fort Collins, Colorado. Leo was born October 4, 1925 to Florence and Joseph Figurski. Leo was raised in Grand Junction, Colorado with brother, Buster deceased and sisters, LaVeta Lorimor and Mary French, who survive. He earned his commission and pilot wings in the Army Air Corps in 1945 and proceeded to serve as a flight instructor until 1950, flying atomic energy geologists throughout the four corners area during the uranium boom. He then went on to earn his Master's degree in Agriculture at Colorado State University in 1959. Following his marriage to Betty Anderson, who survives, in 1955, Leo worked for Colorado A & M Cooperative Extension Service, moving from Salida to Fort Collins to Akron before going to work for the Kansas Cooperative Extension Service in Hiawatha, Kansas in 1966. During that time, Leo and Betty were blessed with four children; Marcia Richards Steve Nelson of Ft. Collins, Patricia Hellmer Dennis of Overland Park, Kansas, Cheryl of Boise, Idaho, and Mike Tiphonie of Colorado Springs who also survive. Following his retirement from KSU Extension in Manhattan, Kansas in 1989, Leo and Betty moved to Fort Collins, Colorado. An accomplished and generous stained glass artist, Leo was an active volunteer in every community in which he lived and loved fishing, hiking, gardening and photography. An active member of each, Leo asked that memorials and remembrances, in lieu of flowers, be directed to his Poudre Golden Kiwanis Club or the senior
