Dorothy Lois Slack Rasplicka went to be with her Lord Jesus Christ on September 5, 2015 in Fort Collins, CO. She was born in Vandalia, Missouri on October 8, 1921 to Carroll Lee Slack and Isola Marie Moss Slack. She graduated from high school in Rock Port, Missouri, attended Peru State Teachers College in Peru, Nebraska and Fresno State in Fresno, California where she took business courses and studied music. She received a diploma from Van Sant School of Business in Omaha, Nebraska in November 1941.

Dorothy moved to Denver, Colorado in 1947 and worked in the Personnel Department of the VA Hospital and then as the Executive Secretary for the Manager of the VA Hospital in Denver. She married Jay Irl Rasplicka on December 27, 1952.
