May 8, 1931 - April 1, 2009

Georgia Mae Colter, 77, of Fort Collins, died April 1, 2009 at her residence. Georgia was born May 8, 1931 in Napoleon, Missouri to Daniel William Overhelman and Edna Charlotte Struwe Oberhelman. Georgia moved to Laramie, Wyo. with her husband, Virgil; and son, Chris, where they were involved in Sqaredancing and bowling. She worked as a seamstress, and as a secretary for DeWald Stone Work.
