Glenn F. Cox, 78, of Windsor, formerly of the Arvada/Lakewood, Colorado area passed away at home November 17, 2009. Mr. Cox was a Kansas farm boy, born April 30, 1931 in Ashland, Kansas to Herman J. and Eva B. Cox. He came to faith at an early age, most recently attending Timberline Church.
