Harold Robert Mein passed away peacefully on September 11, 2015. Harold was born of Robert Arthur Mein and Florence Edna (Nicholson) Mein in Springer, New Mexico on November 17, 1926. They moved to Fort Collins, Colorado in 1937. He served in the US Navy during World War II as a Seaman First Class from March 5, 1945 until being honorably discharged on July 14, 1946.
