On December 19, 2022 our beloved Mom passed on. Jane Frances Stanyon was born May 18, 1933 on Staten Island, NY to Clarice Greene-Stanyon and Earl R. Stanyon. She grew up in Wyckoff, NJ, attended Syracuse University, receiving a B.S. degree in 1955. On December 23, 1956 she married Ernest C. Frank, and in 1959 they moved to Fort Collins, CO. Jane worked for 27 years as a Library Technician at Colorado State University Libraries, retiring in 2001 from full and part-time work. She took classes at both CSU and Front Range Community College.
