Jack Glover was born on March 28, 1937, in Steubenville, Ohio, to his parents, John and Ethel.

Jack attended the University of Iowa, where he was the drum major in the Marching Band. He was fortunate enough to lead the marching band in the 1957 Rose Bowl, setting the example for his own sons to love music and participate in their own college marching bands.

especially capturing the beauty of nature. He was a caring person who always looked out for his neighbors. While living in Colorado, Jack and Donna had a home in Estes Park to enjoy the mountains as well as time with family and friends. He also enjoyed spending time working with his hands, doing woodworking, and making furniture for his family.

Jack will be remembered for his kindness, his passion for the outdoors, and his dedication to his family and community.
