Laura Lee Pratt passed away from a sudden heart attack on November 29, 2022. She was born in Pittsfield, Massachusetts, on June 1, 1957, to Thomas and Mary Jane (Warren) Caliento. 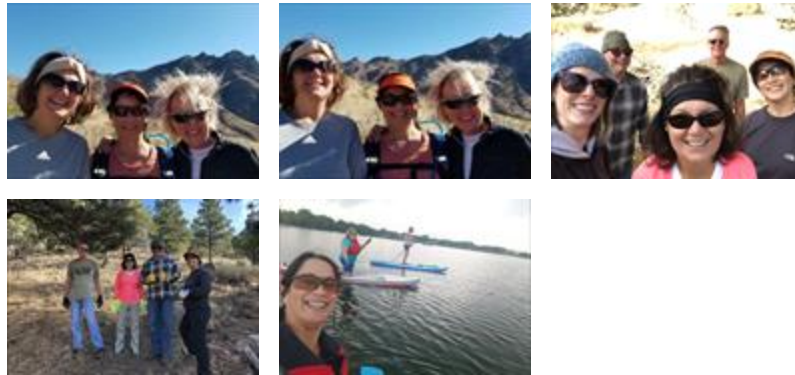

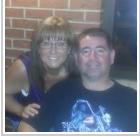

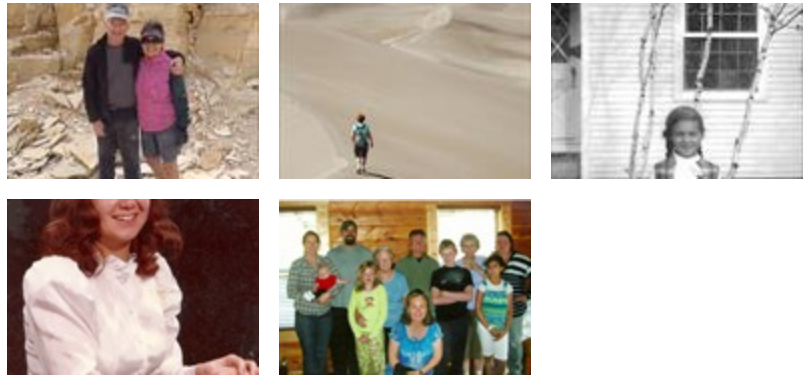
