“Happy birthday to my beautiful daughter 🍷🌸👧 who I love so much. I wish you were here to eat the messed up cake I would have made and the little gift that I would have given you. You can never know how much I love you even now as an angel 🙏👼👤. The world is so ugly now with the virus, black lives matter, and him and his administration.

At 4:38 pm, after 14 hours of labor, I gave birth to a screaming baby. You weighed 8lbs 12oz and 21” long. I cried when I saw you and then your dad carried you to the nursery. It’s kind of funny but I didn’t gain very much weight and when you were born, a gallon of fluid gushed out and I could hear the doctor and nurses shoes squeak on the floor. You had some blood sugar problems so you were in the NICU. When I got back to my room, the nurse brought you to me and told me not to expect you to nurse easily the first time but as soon as you latched on you started sucking like no tomorrow!! We both were discharged on the 29th with the knowledge that you had a slightly higher jaundice and had to go to the doctor on Monday to check your level. We had a wonderful weekend with you and your dad was so happy to have a little girl. But on Monday, your bilirubin was very high and the doctor said that the level was just below a point where you could develop brain disorders and told us to go back to Memorial Hospital ER. When we got out of the doctors office, I fell against the wall and felt as though I would pass out. We went to the hospital and they put you under UV lights to speed up the absorption of the bilirubin. You had to have several blood tests a day and although this little Philippine lab girl took the blood from your heel with no problems, this huge fellow cried a little when he took blood from your tiny foot. You were finally able to get out from the lights for a little while and your dad put you in your first dress and while you were in the glass and paraded around the ward showing you off. We finally after a few days, we went home to start life as a family.

We went on camping trips, exploring Colorado and sharing good times with friends like Tina and Harold and their kids. After your dad

left you and I were a little team until I was stupid and selfish enough to marry again. I was just writing Karen yesterday how you and I traveled to the 4 corners to visit. I will always have a place in my heart for our time we spent together. I wish I could have never gone back to dan and got a place for just you and I. I'm so very sorry I failed you as a parent. But I always loved you, my baby girl 🌸💕💕👉
