April 4, 1939 - December 15, 2011

Roger A. Hoar, beloved husband and father, 72, of Loveland, CO, passed away December 15, 2011 after a brief illness. He was born on April 4, 1939 in Spooner, WI to Allan and Mary Trine Hoar. He graduated from Shell Lake High School in Shell Lake, Wisconsin, in 1957. He married his high school sweetheart, Janet Livingston Hoar on August 15, 1959. He attended the University of Wisconsin and University of Wisconsin-Stout, Menomonie, WI. He also attended Colorado State University at Ft. Collins, CO, Colorado Mountain College at Steamboat Springs, CO, and University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, MN. Before their marriage he served in the Navy ROTC. In the early years of their marriage he served on the Wisconsin State Patrol. In 1962 he became a qualified, registered Explosive Ordinance Reconnaissance Agent. Later he was in the heavy equipment field, was a Deputy Sheriff and Detective for Routt County Sheriff's Dept. in Steamboat Springs, CO, and also taught hydraulics, heavy equipment and diesel mechanics at Drott Proving Grounds in Wausau, WI and Wyoming Technical College in Laramie, WY. He is survived by his loving wife, Janet; son and daughter-in-law, Marty and Renae Rogge Hoar of Loveland, CO; daughter and son-in-law Nancy and Jon James of Wellington, CO; brother, Mick Hoar of Duvall, WA; grandchildren from Marty's family, Brianna, Zachary and Rebecca of Loveland, and grandchildren from Nancy's family, Shay of Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates, and Cody and Colton of Wellington. He was preceded in death by his parents. Roger loved his years in law enforcement and later went on to write four

novels about all his experiences that he encountered and friendships he made along the way. Among his hobbies were cars, hunting, reading and playing cribbage; he was also an excellent marksman with a pistol. Memorial service will be held at 1:00 p.m. on Friday, December 23, 2011 at Bohlender Funeral Chapel in Ft. Collins, CO.
