He pursued higher education at Penn State University, earning both undergraduate and master's degrees in electrical engineering. 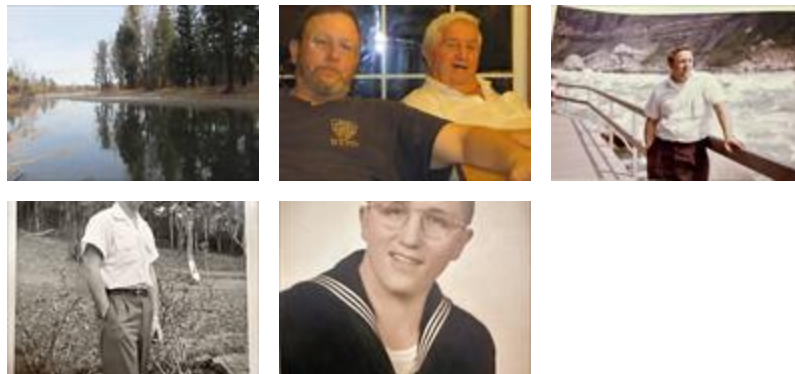
