Ruth H. Doyle died April 3, 2009. She was born Oct. 18, 1925 in Ashland, Ohio, to William and Bertha Kestner. She attended Ashland schools, Capitol University and Western Reserve University. As many other young people did following World War II, they moved to Fort Collins, where Jim graduated from Colorado State University in 1949. She loved traveling, camping, gardening and the Colorado mountains. In recent years, she was active in Auntie Stone Questers and CSU Women's association. She is survived by her husband, Jim, her daughter, Kathleen Doyle of Golden; son, James W. Doyle of Burbank, Calif., and niece, Barbara Hower of Ashland, Ohio.
