



## Warren Eugene Williams

January 21, 1922 - June 18, 2012

Warren Eugene Williams, 90, of Fort Collins, died June 18, 2012 at Poudre Valley Hospital. Mr. Williams was born January 21, 1922 on a farm near Council Grove, Kansas to Orval Emmett and Cassie Albert "Clymer" Williams. Warren was married to Vevia Dickinson, Mareta ""Kowaluk" Eaton and Gertrude Ruth Newton. Mr. Williams graduated from Eskridge High School in Eskridge, Kansas. He was a veteran of WWII in the Army/Air Corps and served in the European Theater in Europe and North Africa as a glider mechanic. He moved to Fort Collins in 1945 after the war. Warren worked as a Laborer in construction most of his life. Warren was a member of the VFW Cooties, Local #720 Laborers and Hod Carriers, American Legion and National Rifle Association. He loved fishing, storytelling and had a wonderful sense of humor. Survivors include his son, Warren Emmett Williams Debbie of Fort Lupton; 3 daughters, Sharon Dick Taylor of Douglas, Wyoming, Linda Bentley of Cocoa, Florida, and Genevieve Lee Williamson of Kansas; sisters, Eloise Lee Carl of Laporte, Colorado, Alberta Lee of Fort Collins, Colorado and Beth Edgar Seaworth of Fort Collins; his second wife, Mareta Eaton of Ft. Collins, numerous grandchildren and great-grandchildren, nieces and nephews. Preceding Warren in death are his parents; six brothers and two sisters; his wife, Gertrude Ruth Williams and long time companion, Marcia Wood.
